Tambopata Research Centre is the most remote lodge in the Amazon. There are no humans nearby so sightings of monkeys, macaws and other large species become more frequent. Jaguars are sometimes seen near the river bank! Tambopata Research Centre is an excellent headquarters for in depth explorations of Amazonian nature and wildlife because of its remote location in uninhabited wilderness housing stable populations of endangered wildlife, the small scale of its infrastructure and operations and the presence of researchers and naturalist guides. **Choose from a range of stays from 2 nights or more. Guests benefit from knowledgeable guides who provide an in-depth understanding of life in the rainforest of Tambopata. Enjoy an open wall facing the rainforest and awake with the sounds of jungle. # **Highlights Include:**

**Two Macaw Clay Licks** â A trip to the Tambopata Research Centre includes a visit to the two most important clay licks in the region: Colorado and Chuncho. Visit these special portions of river bank while macaws and parrots make a raucous and colourful spectacle which inspired a National Geographic cover story.

**Jaguar Sighting** â∏ The four and half hour boat ride from Refugio Amazonas to Tambopata Research Centre is your best chance for a jaguar sighting.

**5 Distinct Pristine Habitats** â Close and easy hikes to bamboo, flood plain, terra firma, palm and riverine rainforest habitats.

research has been carried out from the Centre and you are likely to have the chance during your stay to talk with macaw biologists, ecologists and other experts staying at the Research Centre while they do fieldwork.

**Canopy Tower** â□□ During your stopover at Refugio Amazonas you will be able to climb the 30 metre scaffolding tower for expansive views of the rainforest and sightings of colourful toucans and parrots against a green backdrop.

# **ITINERARY**

DAY 1: Arrival at Tambopata Research Centre

To begin your rainforest adventure, you will take a quick flight from Lima or Cuzco to the Amazonian city of Puerto Maldonado, in Southeastern Peru. Upon arrival at Puerto Maldonado Airport, a representative will greet you and accompany you on the journey to the lodge. You will be taken on a one-hour road trip, followed by a boat ride on the Tambopata River, to arrive at Tambopata Research Centre. During the trip, there will be a stop at the local office where you can repack your luggage, bringing only necessary items for the next four days. The remaining belongings will be securely stored at the office. Upon reaching the lodge, you will be warmly welcomed and given a brief orientation. After dinner, you have the option to participate in a night walk, where you can observe the animals that are active during the evening, but often difficult to spot. The nocturnal frogs, with their captivating shapes and colors, as well as interesting sounds, can be seen more easily. Note: Please ensure that your flight arrives in Puerto Maldonado before 12:30PM.



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# DAY 2: Tambopata Activities Day 2

Tambopata Research Centre offers a range of activities which will vary from day to day. Below is a guide of what experiences you can expect during your stay. On most clear mornings of the year, dozens of large macaws and hundreds of parrots congregate on this large river bank in a raucous and colourful spectacle that inspired a National Geographic cover story. Discretely located fifty meters from the cliff, we will observe Green-winged, Scarlet, and Blue-and-gold Macaws and several species of smaller parrots descend to ingest clay. This takes place at dawn when the lick is most active. This five-kilometre trail covers the prototypical rain forest with immense trees crisscrossed by creeks and ponds. Amongst the figs, ceibas, and shihuahuacos we will go for a monkey search, the most common being, Squirrel, Brown Capuchin, and Spider Monkeys as well as peccaries. After lunch back at the lodge, we will venture ten minutes upriver to explore the island where there is a tiny pond with a platform in the middle. It is a great place to spot waterfowl such as Muscovy duck, sunbittern and hoatzin along with the woodpeckers, oropendolas, flycatchers, and parakeets that all call this pond their home. Later in the evening, after dinner, scientists will provide a night lecture. This provides an in-depth look at the biology of macaws, their feeding habits, the theories for clay lick use, their breeding and feeding ecology, population fluctuations, and the threats to their conservation.



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#### DAY 3: Tambopata Activities Day 3

Tambopata Research Centre offers a range of activities which will vary from day to day. Below is a guide of what experiences you can expect during your stay. Heading off at dawn, we carefully step over the winding "highways" of peaceful leaf-cutter ants, on our Rainforest Master Hike which will leave you with unforgettable memories and a profound sense of accomplishment. Due to their years of local experience, our Tambopata Research Centre guides know everything about the forest. They'll spot the tiniest bird hiding in the canopy, the most elusive monkey, and the most spectacular plant life being sure to point these out to you as we explore. Plenty of wildlife is present when taking these jungle walks and a real sense of being at one with nature. The afternoon will be free for you to relax around the lodge and listen to the wildlife that talks throughout the day. Twilight descends early in the jungle. Under the thick tree cover of the rainforest, darkness falls quickly, when the light cannot slip through the foliage any longer. Now, as afternoon slips into evening, you're about to see one of the world's most spectacular sunsets. Heading out after dinner on a spectacular Sunset Cruise, which floats down the wide river watching countless oranges and pinks reflecting off the water in lovely patterns while keeping an eye out for wildlife and listening to the jungle noises.



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#### DAY 4: Departure

After breakfast, you will embark on a three-hour journey back to Puerto Maldonado for your departure flight. The trip includes a boat ride followed by a 1-hour road transfer to Puerto Maldonado. This provides a final opportunity to immerse yourself in the breathtaking natural scenery of the Tambopata National Reserve, offering a chance to spot a variety of wildlife along the way. Please note: Departure from the lodge is at 7am and arrival in Puerto Maldonado around 10am. Departing flights must be booked after 11:30AM to allow sufficient time for your transfer to the airport.
