For those yearning for a quick taste of the Galapagos, this is the perfect journey. On board the mega-catamaran Cormorant II, you will experience the highest degree of comfort and luxury as you cruise through this incredible and pristine archipelago. Stumble upon white sandy beaches home to sun-baking and curious sea lions. Encounter unique wildlife from tortoises and marine iguanas to pink flamingos and flightless cormorants. This is a truly incredible experience perfect for those searching for a quick taste of this beautiful eco-system.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: Arrival and Kicker Rock

Morning flight from either Quito or Guayaquil to San Cristobal, Galapagos Island. After passing through immigration and baggage claim, you will be met by our representative and transferred to the yacht. You will be shown to your cabin where you will have some time to settle in before lunch and a welcome briefing. In the afternoon you will head to Kicker rock. This striking rock formation is located a couple hours off the western shore of San Cristobal. Jutting out of the water, the rocks stand vertically at hundreds of feet above the ocean divided by a small channel. Although there are no landing areas, kayaking and scuba diving allow visitors to spot a variety of marine life.





DAY 2: Suarez Point and Gardner Bay

In the morning you will arrive at Suarez Point. This area is great for spotting blue-footed boobies, albatrosses and Nazca boobies. A beautiful site on the ocean front, the large waved albatrosses use the cliff as a launching pad. The famous attraction is the magnificent blowhole, spurting water high into the air. This site presents wonderful photograph opportunities. In the afternoon you will head for Gardner Bay. Gardner Bay, on the eastern side of the island, is the breeding site of nearly all of the world's 12,000 pairs of waved albatrosses. It has an ample white sandy beach with a myriad of sea lions, perfect for relaxing. Its rocky shores make this site a great place for diving and snorkelling.



DAY 3: Cormorant Point and Post Office Bay

In the morning you will head for Cormorant Point. This site hosts a large flamingo lagoon where other birds such as common stilts and white-cheeked pintails can also be seen. The beaches on this island are distinct: The "Green Beach" named so due to its green color, which comes from a high percentage of olivine crystals in the sand, and the "Four Sand Beach" composed of white coral. In the afternoon you will head to Post Office Bay. In the 18th century whalers passing through the islands placed a wooden barrel on Floreana Island for use as an unofficial mail box. The tradition continues today as visitors leave addressed postcards in the barrel and sort through left mail to deliver at home.



DAY 4: Tortoise Breeding Centre and Departure

Embark on a captivating morning expedition to Los Gemelos, also known as the Twin Craters, situated on opposite sides of the road that connects Puerto Ayora to Baltra. These formations, while not authentic craters, are a stunning result of the collapse of surface materials within concealed underground fissures and chambers. As you explore, the breathtaking vista before you unveils a testament to the intricate natural processes that have sculpted this awe-inspiring landscape. Afterward you will be transferred to the airport for your departure flight.
