You start the adventure in vibrant Quito, before taking in the colourful markets of Otavalo where you can shop for handicrafts made by local artisans, chat to friendly locals and try some delicious food. You will drive on the famous Pan-American Highway, visit local communities, and pass by snow-capped mountains, waterfalls and beautiful lakes. You can practice your bartering skills at the many markets, learn of local cultures, witness stunning architecture and immerse yourself in a beautiful and deep history in one of the most fascinating places in Latin America.

# **ITINERARY**

DAY 1: Arrival transfer in Quito

On arrival, please make your way through to the Arrivals Hall where our representative will be waiting for you to transfer you to your hotel. He/she will be holding a sign with your name on it. Should you not be able to locate them, please refer to the front of your itinerary for emergency contact details of our representative office. Please note this service is with a driver only.





DAY 1: Quito

Sitting at 2,850 metres above sea level high in the Andean foothills lies Quito, the capital of Ecuador. The city, a short distance from the Equator and with an amazing backdrop of snow-capped mountains, is known for its stunning colonial architecture and art-work. Founded in the 16th century on the ruins of an Inca city, Quito has one of the largest, least-altered and best-preserved historic centres in the Americas. It was declared a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site in 1978.



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### DAY 2: Quito to Otavalo Hacienda

Depart Quito with your tour guide, heading to Otavalo, the town famous for its weekly artesian market. En route on the Panamerican Highway stop at Calderon, a town where the famous masapan dolls are made, continuing on through Guayllabamba town where you can sample its typical fruit, the cherimoyer. Stop on the highway to admire the beautiful landscape and snow-capped mountains in the area. Continue on, making a short stop at San Pablo Lake before arriving at the hacienda.



# DAY 3: Otavalo Indian Village Tour & Cuicocha Lake

On this excursion visit three indigenous communities with the opportunity to observe handicrafts being made, such as mats of the 'totora plant', musical Andean instruments, and the process of making shawls in a traditional way. The tour also includes a visit to the waterfall at Peguche which is a sacred site and a visit to the town of Cotacachi, known for its leather shops. End the tour at the beautiful volcanic Cuicocha Lake and take a short boat trip before lunch at a local restaurant in Otavalo. The rest of the afternoon will be at leisure.





DAY 4: Otavalo Indigenous Market & Return to Ouito

In the morning visit the textile market located at the Plaza de Ponchos; this is one of the most famous markets in South America. You will find all kinds of handcrafts including tapestries made on the Spanish weaving loom as well as on the indigenous backstrap loom. Then enjoy some free time for bargaining and buying from the friendly Otavaleños. After a full day spent in Otavalo, return to Quito and you will be taken to your hotel.



DAY 5: Transfer to the airport for onward destination

You will be collected from your hotel at the appropriate time and transferred to the airport for your onward flight.

Currently almost half of our office based staff commute to work via bicycle.

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
