INTRODUCTION

Island hop around the unforgettable Galapagos Islands on our Beluga yacht. It has all the comforts you need for such a trip, but you won't miss a second of the fascinating wildlife the area has to offer. With panoramic windows and a spacious decking, your camera will capture everything. Start your escape on Santa Cruz island, paddle in lagoons and witness sea lions, marine turtles, giant iguanas and penguins. You will see volcanoes, beautiful scenery, islands that will stay with you forever and wildlife you could usually only see through the eyes of David Attenborough.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: Embark on M/Y Beluga

Depart from Quito or Guayaquil to Isla Baltra on a two hour flight. Transfer by boat and on land to Puerto Ayora on Isla Santa Cruz before taking a speed boat to Isla Isabela to embark upon the M/Y Beluga.

DAY 2: Punta Moreno & Elizabeth Bay, Isla Isabela

In the morning visit Punta Moreno to see its black water lagoons, flamingos and white cheeked pintail ducks. Continue on to Elizabeth Bay where you can observe flightless cormorants, brown pelicans, rays, marine turtles, sea lions and lava herons. There is also a large area of giant red mangroves.

DAY 3: Urbina Bay & Tagus Cove, Isla Isabela

Lying at the foot of Alcedo Volcano is Urbina Bay, one of the best and most recent examples of geological uplift in the Galapagos. Here you can see penguins, noddy terns, marine iguanas and historic graffiti. In the afternoon visit Tagus Cove, a narrow channel directly east of Fernandina on the west coast of Isabela Island. The cove's quiet waters make for an ideal panga ride beneath its sheltered cliffs, where blue-footed boobies, brown noddies, pelicans and noddy terns make their nests, and flightless cormorants and penguins inhabit the lava ledges.


DAY 4: Punta Espinoza & Punta Vicente Roca

Head to Isla Fernandina for Punta Espinoza to see flightless cormorant, pelicans, sea lions, sally light foot crabs and an abundance of marine iguanas can be seen along the shores of one of world's most active volcanoes. In the afternoon travel to Punta Vicente Roca, a wonderful snorkelling site, where you can usually see turtles as well as all kinds of fish. After the snorkelling take a panga ride, which will give you the opportunity to study some of the Galapagos' spectacular geological rock formations. Nazca boobies, pelicans, swallow-tailed gulls, marine iguanas, flightless cormorants and penguins are often seen in the area.

DAY 5: Puerto Egas to Isla Bartolomé

At Puerto Egas (James Island) you will see Galapagos fur seals in pools cut into lava cliffs and there is a good chance of spotting the Galapagos hawk, the Galapagos dove and the vermilion flycatcher. Tucked behind Espumilla Beach are salt water lagoons where flamingos and white cheeked pintail ducks may be seen. In the afternoon, continue to Bartolomé Island to take a walk through volcanic sand, which can be difficult to cross. Once through the sand, the steep ascent continues up a wooden stairway. Upon landing, the walk will take approximately 30 to 40 minutes. Nowhere else better portrays the geological history of the Islands.

DAY 6: North Seymour to Isla Baltra

North of Baltra is the small islet of North Seymour. The largest colony of magnificent frigate birds is found here, as well as nesting blue-footed boobies and swallow-tailed gulls. Enjoy breakfast before a transfer to the airport for your flight to the mainland.
