

PUNO TO SAN PEDRO DE ATACAMA



INTRODUCTION

Join this exciting small group tour with likeminded individuals from Puno to San Pedro de Atacama. Start your journey travelling to Copacabana to visit the famous Virgen Morena and take the boat to Isla del Sol. Explore the Chincana ruins and the Sacred Rock in La Paz and enjoy a city tour to the colonial part of the city and treat yourself to a handicraft from one of the street markets. Cross the impressive Salt Flats of Uyuni, go to the high Andean valley of Alota and visit Laguna Colorada before you arrive at the end of your trip.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: Puno - Island of the Sun

This morning you will be collected from your hotel and transferred by road to Copacabana located on Lake Titicaca, Bolivia. Stroll around the town before boarding a boat to Sun Island. On arrival at Huacani Port enjoy a typical Aptaipi lunch in the highlands before hiking to Ecolodge Estancia. Dinner included.



DAY 2: Island of the Sun - La Paz

Don't miss an early sunrise. After breakfast, board the boat and cruise north to visit the Chincana ruins and the Sacred Rock and continue to the Island of the Moon and see the Iñak Uyu ruins. Lunch included Enroute. Return to Copacabana and continue by road to La Paz.

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DAY 3: Half Day City & Moon Valley tour

Experience a city tour of La Paz, elected as one of the New 7 Wonder Cities of the world. Located in a valley at the foothills of the Andes Range, at 3,632m (11942 ft) above sea level. The tour goes through the street markets rich in handicrafts, weavings, and witchcraft items, followed by a visit to the colonial section of the city, San Francisco Church, Gold Museum, Murillo Square also visit to the viewpoint 'Mirador de Killi Killi'; and the outdoor replica of Tiwanaku temple. Then descending to the more modern, southern part of La Paz, visit the Valley of the Moon, where a clay mountain has been impressively shaped by erosion. Conclude the tour with a cable ride aboard Mi Teleferico, the world's highest cable car system and offering spectacular views of the city.



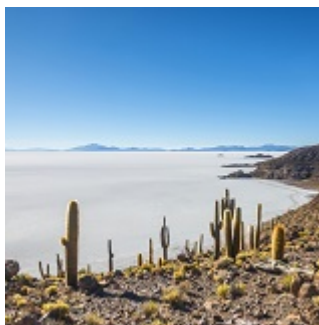
DAY 4: La Paz - Uyuni - Colchani

This morning you will be transferred to the airport for your flight to Uyuni. On arrival at Uyuni, you will be met and transferred to Colchani, located on the shores of the Uyuni Salt Flats. Visit the village and its surroundings to see locals producing salt. Travel through the salt flats crossing Isla Incahuasi, a special habitat of giant cactus and volcanic rocks. Continue north to see Pucara de Ayque at the foothills of the Tunupa Volcano. Return to Colchani and enjoy the sunset and overnight in a unique hotel made of salt. Lunch and dinner included.



DAY 5: Colchani - Uyuni - Villamar

Today travel south to Villamar. Enroute visit the cemetery of old trains, the villages of San Cristobal Mine, Culpina K and the rich and high Andean Valley of Alota. Breakfast, lunch and dinner included.



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DAY 6: Villamar – Hito Cajon Border

Visit REA (Reserva Eduardo Abaroa), Bolivia’s most visited national park and home to Laguna Colorada, Laguna Verde, geysers, hot springs and over 30,000 Andean flamingos and rare wildlife. Continue to Hijo Cajon, the border crossing into Chile where services end. Lunch included.
