

SOUTH AMERICA - TITICACA UNCOVERED





INTRODUCTION

Best known as the "Sacred Lake", Lake Titikaka is the highest navigable lake in the world (3810 meters above mean sea level), and is shared between Peru and Bolivia, with a total extension of 8400 km2.

It is divided in two basins: the great lake, sprinkled with islands beholders of archeological remains, which are a testament of the domain that the Aymara civilization exerted in this region. The minor lake has an exceptional landscape as the Royal Andean Mountain range can be appreciated on the northern side. The Tiwanaku civilization, one of the most representative of our country, lived around this part of the lake.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: Puno / Tiwanaku Ruins / La Paz

Private transportation from Puno to Desaguadero (boarder Peru/Bolivia). Continue the trip to Tiwanaku passing the highlands, one of the oldest American cultures, considered the cradle of the American man. Visit the temple of Kalasasaya, Gate of the Sun, monoliths Ponce and Fraile, Akapana pyramid and Semiunderground temple, as well as the local museums. Continue to La Paz. Overnight in hotel.





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DAY 2: La Paz city tour

A 4 hour morning tour in of La Paz, including the area of the street markets, rich in handicrafts, weavings and witchcraft artifacts. The tour goes through the colonial part of the city, San Francisco Church, Gold Museum, Murillo Square and the outdoor replica of the Tiwanaku temple. Then to the modern part of town, dropping down a lot in elevation to finally visit the Valley of the Moon, enjoy all of its natural geological formations. Afternoon free. Overnight in hotel.

DAY 3: La Paz / Copacabana / Island of the Sun

Bus trip going north through the highlands and parallel to the Andes Royal Range to Copacabana (3 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours), a nice town in the shores of Lake Titicaca. Visit the famous Virgen Morena and its church, have a stroll of town. Take the boat to the Island of the Sun (1 hour), land in Huacani port, have a typical lunch "Aptapi". Hike for about 45 min to overnight in Ecolodge La Estancia.

DAY 4: Island of the Sun / Copacabana / Puno

DON'T MISS AN EARLY SUNRISE! Take the boat north to visit the Chincana ruins and the Sacred Rock (1 hour), then boat to the Island of the Moon and its Iñak Uyu ruins (1 hour), to finally reach Copacabana (1 ½ hours). Lunch or box lunch included. Transportation by bus to Puno (3 ½ hours).
