INTRODUCTION

Departing from Cusco, the ancient capital of the Inca Empire, the Belmond Andean Explorer sets off across the Altiplano towards Puno on the shores of Lake Titicaca. As the luxury train weaves its way towards Arequipa, there is time to explore Sumbay Caves with their fascinating rock paintings, and the option to visit the Colca Canyon, home to the soaring Andean condor. The train journey ends in the beautiful volcanic â∏White City' of Arequipa.

ITINERARY



DAY 1: Cusco to Puno

The Andean Explorer departs from Cusco, the ancient capital of the Inca Empire, at 11:00 am. Settle into the Observation Car to gaze out across the Altiplano, the highest plains of the Andes, or maybe breathe in the crisp Andean air from the open deck as you travel through the everchanging landscapes towards Puno. Lunch is taken in the elegant dining carriages where fresh seasonal dishes are served, made using locally sourced ingredients from the Peruvian Andes. Afternoon tea is taken on board as the train continues its journey through La Raya mountain range, the colours of the mountains changing with the setting sun. La Raya marks the border between the Cusco and Puno regions and is the highest point on the route at just over 4,300 metres, with spectacular views of the Andes. Dinner is served on board before the train pulls into Lake Titicaca Station where it will stop for the night. Departs every Thursday.



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DAY 2: Puno and Titicaca Lake

This morning we watch the sunrise over Lake Titicaca, the highest navigable lake in the world before a late breakfast on board the train. We then set off by boat to the floating reed islands of Uros situated a few kilometres from Puno. Here the locals continue to practice their traditional way of life, living by fishing. The original inhabitants of these floating islands are said to descend from one of the oldest cultures of the Americas. The Uros Islands, as well as the houses on them and the boats used by their inhabitants, are all made from the totora reeds that grow in Lake Titicaca. Return to the train and enjoy lunch onboard as you depart for the Saracocha Lagoon. On the way enjoy cocktails and canapes and marvel at the views. On arrival in Saracocha you will enjoy a lovely dinner and stay on the train overnight.





DAY 3: Arrival in Arequipa

Enjoy an early breakfast and watch the sunrise over Lake Lagunillas, set at over 4,100 metres above sea level. We visit Sumbay Caves, located within the National Reserve of Salinas and Aguada Blanca. The caves are home to more than 500 cave paintings, thought to have been made by the first settlers in the area, and dating back 6,000 to 8,000 years. At Station Km 93 you have the option to disembark for an excursion to explore the Colca Canyon, one of the deepest canyons in the world surrounded by spectacular cultivated pre-Inca terracing and home to the majestic Andean condor. Please note that the excursion to the Colca Canyon is not included in your train ticket and is at your own expense. If you decide to disembark in Colca canyon, you will then have to make your own way to Arequipa. If you are interested in this excursion, we encourage you to ask your booking agent to arrange this portion of the tour and provide guidance on which extension best suits your individual needs. For those staying on the train, lunch is served on board before our arrival into the "White City" of Arequipa, with its stunning setting framed by the volcanoes Misti, Pikchu and Chachani.
