# INTRODUCTION

The Galapagos Islands offer beautiful and stunning landscapes and an incredible array of fascinating wildlife. Travelling aboard the Yolita for seven nights, this tour takes you to some of the lesser-visited islands such as Genovesa in the north and Isabela in the west. You will see an amazing concentration of birdlife and vast bird rookeries, including large nesting colonies of red-footed boobies and frigatebirds. Hike to the top of the Sierra Negra, the most recently active volcano in the Galapagos, stroll along white-sand beaches in amongst iguanas and sea lions and snorkel in the sunken caldera of Darwin Bay and around Pinnacle Rock.

# **ITINERARY**

DAY 1: Quito

On arrival in Quito you will be met and transferred to your hotel.





DAY 2: Sucre International Airport/Seymour Airport

This morning you will be transferred early to the airport for your flight to the Galapagos Islands. On arrival in Baltra, you will be met by your naturalist guide and transferred to Puerto Ayora to board the ship. The Galapagos Islands are located about 1000 kilometres (620 miles) off the Pacific coast of South America. The archipelago is comprised of 13 major islands and scores of islets that served as a living laboratory for Charles Darwin, the renowned evolution theorist. Long before Darwin arrived in the Galapagos, seafarers knew these isolated islands as home to some of the strangest and most wonderful wildlife imaginable, including birds that could swim but no longer fly, aquatic iguanas, dragon-like lizards left over from prehistoric times and the giant Galapagos tortoises for which the islands were named. In the afternoon we visit Playa las Bachas (Bachas Beach), located on the north eastern tip of Santa Cruz. Here the sand is made of decomposed coral, making it soft and white and a favourite site for nesting sea turtles. As you stroll along the beach, you may see colourful Sally-Lightfoot crabs on the lave rocks along the shoreline. Trek with the guide to look for a range of wildlife including flamingos, hermit crabs, frigatebirds, black-necked stilts and sea lions. We return to the Yolita with its spacious cabins and large upper deck where you can soak up the sun's rays and enjoy the scenery. The ship sails overnight so you wake up refreshed and ready to explore the next destination.



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#### DAY 3: Isla Genovesa

Today we make a landing at Genovesa, also known as Bird Island, an old imploded volcano. We walk along the white coral sands of Darwin Bay and follow the trail to see the massive colonies of frigatebirds, boobies, gulls and other seabirds as well as striking volcanic cliffs that rise from the ocean. There is an option to snorkel at Darwin Bay in the sunken caldera. Here you can see huge schools of tropical fish that swarm near the vertical walls and you may be lucky enough to see a hammerhead shark or manta ray. We also visit El Barranco, or Prince Philip's Steps, a steep pathway with excellent views and amazing birdlife. Located on the southern tip of the island, this is an amazing wildlife watching opportunity. We hike up the steps to see a seabird colony teeming with life including the breeding grounds for red-footed boobies and masked boobies.



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## DAY 4: Isla Bartolomé/Sullivan Bay

We visit Bartolomé and have a guided tour of the dramatic volcanic features of the island, before hiking to a panoramic viewpoint. At the summit of the island you will gain an understanding of its volcanic origins and enjoy a spectacular view. The island is famous for Pinnacle Rock, one of the most iconic rock formations in the Galapagos and an excellent spot for swimming and snorkelling. Here you may encounter Galapagos penguins, sea turtles, sea lions, whitetip reef sharks and a huge variety of fish. The Galapagos penguin is the only species of penguin found north of the Equator. We continue to Sullivan Bay on Isla Santiago to witness the striking giant lava formations that contrast with the white coral sand beach. Plant life is sparse on the island due to its harsh environment and relatively new lava flow. We enjoy a walk along the lava formations before reaching a white coral sand beach, where abundant Sally Lightfoot crabs and sea lions gather on the shore.





#### DAY 5: Isabela Island

Wake up for an early morning landing in the charming coastal town of Puerto Villamil. After breakfast, you'll embark on a scenic hike to the Sierra Negra Volcano, which boasts the largest basaltic caldera in the Galápagos. Along the way, take in the breathtaking views of the surrounding landscape and keep an eye out for the diverse array of flora and fauna that call the area home. After a morning of hiking and exploring, you'll return to Puerto Villamil for a delicious lunch. In the afternoon, you'll have the opportunity to visit the nearby tortoise breeding center and learn about conservation efforts to protect these magnificent creatures. Get up close and personal with the gentle giants as you observe them in their natural habitat.



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## DAY 6: Elizabeth Bay/Urbina Bay

This morning sees us visiting Elizabeth Bay with its amazing marine life and bird viewing opportunities. We take a panga ride to explore the mangroves and shallows in search of wildlife such as sea turtles, rays and the flightless cormorant in the sheltered waters. We also keep a lookout for blue-footed boobies, Galapagos penguins and pelicans that feed on the abundant marine life. In the afternoon we make a visit to Urbina Bay, located at the base of Alcedo Volcano where we hike along a trail for views of the caldera, looking out for land iguanas along the way. This unique walk takes us along a vast marine reef that was raised out of the water during an uplift in 1950. Here we will see dried coral "sculptures" and other ocean formations. Urbina Bay is a great place to see flightless cormorants, brown pelicans, marine turtles, rays and vivid yellow land iguanas.





## DAY 7: Tagus Cove/Punta Espinoza

Our first stop this morning is at Tagus Cove, an anchorage site on Isabela Island that was popular among whalers and pirates. We tour the area on foot, hiking to a lookout for spectacular views of Darwin Lake (a spherical saltwater crater) and Darwin Bay as well as Darwin and Wolf volcanoes. Once we land, we climb the wooden stairway to the trail entrance, following the trail through a dry vegetation zone. We will see old graffiti on the cliffs, made by whalers and pirates that visited the cove. We continue to ascend to a promontory made up of small volcanic cones or spatter cones. Later we continue to Punta Espinoza on Fernandina, the youngest of the Galapagos Islands, home to a large colony of marine iguanas and a variety of bird species. There are a number of trails that can be followed including a path along the beach and across lava flows that provides a unique opportunity to explore one of the least-visited areas of the Galapagos archipelago.



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## DAY 8: Bucaneer's cove and Rabida island

Begin your day with an exciting morning panga ride in Buccaneer Cove, located in the heart of Santiago Island. Keep an eye out for playful sea lions, various species of shorebirds, and fascinating lava formations as you glide through the cove's clear waters. After the ride, continue your exploration with an afternoon excursion to the unique red sand beaches of Rábida Island, where you'll have the opportunity to observe a lagoon and sea lion colony up close. Get ready for an unforgettable snorkeling experience as you swim amongst schools of colorful tropical fish and curious sea lions in the crystal clear waters nearby. Don't forget to bring your camera to capture the vibrant colors and beautiful scenery of this stunning island.





## DAY 9: Islas Daphne/Quito

Our final landing is at Daphne, a tiny conical island composed of a volcanic tuff that is home to nesting blue-footed boobies, frigatebirds, Darwin's finches and other incredible wildlife. Many of the finches are banded, as a result of Dr. Peter Grant's long-term study of Darwin's finches on the island. As we explore the Daphne on foot, there are great birdwatching opportunities and we will discover the island's interesting flora and geology. In the afternoon you will be transferred to the airport for the flight back to Quito. On arrival there is a transfer to the group hotel with time to enjoy one last night in Ecuador's capital.



## DAY 10: Quito

Today is free for you to explore Quito at your leisure until your departure time.
