INTRODUCTION

This tour allows you to spend five days exploring the incredible wildlife-rich Galapagos Islands made famous by Charles Darwin, with one night in a hotel in Puerto Ayora followed by 3 nights aboard the Yolita. Learn about the history and wildlife of the central and southern islands as you cruise amongst them. Discover the magical underwater world at Devil's Crown, a snorkeler's paradise and home to some of the most impressive marine life in the Galapagos archipelago. Marvel at the vast array of birdlife as you look out for frigatebirds, Darwin's finches and boobies; encounter ancient giant tortoises and walk amongst colonies of iguanas and sea lions.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: Quito


On arrival into Quito you will be met and transferred to your hotel.





DAY 2: Quito/Puerto Ayora

This morning you will be transferred early to the airport for your flight to the Galapagos Islands. On arrival in Baltra, you will be met by your guide and transferred to the hotel in Puerto Ayora where you will spend your first night in the Galapagos. The Galapagos Islands are located about 1000 kilometres (620 miles) off the Pacific coast of South America. The archipelago is comprised of 13 major islands and scores of islets that served as a living laboratory for Charles Darwin, the renowned evolution theorist. Long before Darwin arrived in the Galapagos, seafarers knew these isolated islands as home to some of the strangest and most wonderful wildlife imaginable, including birds that could swim but no longer fly, aquatic iguanas, dragon-like lizards left over from prehistoric times and the giant Galapagos tortoises for which the islands were named. We check into the hotel before having lunch followed by a short afternoon hike to the beautiful white sand beach of Tortuga Bay and a kayak ride amongst the mangroves. Tortuga Bay (Turtle Bay) is a great place to see sea turtles, sea lions, marine iguanas, pelicans, flamingos and lava gulls which are endemic to the islands and commonly found along the shores. The two beaches at Tortuga Bay are separated by red mangroves. You may see tintoreras sharks, turtles and manta rays in the shallow waters. There is also the opportunity to explore the mangroves by kayak. As you paddle through the waters, look out for the wide variety of marine life, including colourful reef fish, rays and sea turtles. Afterwards, relax on the beautiful fine white sand beach where you may see iguanas basking in the sun.



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DAY 3: Puerto Ayora/Santa Cruz

This morning we transfer to the Yolita where you will meet the crew and settle in. This afternoon, we visit the giant tortoises of El Chato Reserve. El Chato Reserve is located in the highlands of Santa Cruz Island and here it is possible to see giant land tortoises in the wild in their natural environment. We explore the Reserve's lagoon and lava tunnels, keeping an eye out for owls that often roost in the entrances to the tunnels. We return to the Yolita with its spacious cabins and large upper deck where you can soak up the sun's rays and enjoy the scenery. The ship sails overnight so you wake up refreshed and ready to explore the next destination.





DAY 4: Punta Cormorant/Floreana Island

We land at Punta Cormorant, the only landing site on Floreana Island. The landing site is a green sand beach, coloured by olivine crystals, volcanicderived silicates of magnesium and iron. Around the point, Corona del Diablo, or Devil's Crown derives its name from the broken remains of a partially submerged volcanic cone. This is a perfect spot to go snorkelling from the boat, as the waters are home to large schools of colourful tropical fish, rays, reef sharks and sea turtles that make their home among the coral reef. You need to be a strong swimmer to snorkel here as the currents can be intense. In the afternoon we visit historic Post Office Bay. In the late 18th century, English whaling vessels placed a barrel here to be used as a post office. Today, the box is used mainly by tourists, who drop off and pick up unstamped letters to be carried to far destinations.



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DAY 5: Chinese Hat/Cerro Dragon

This morning sees us visiting Sombrero Chino (Chinese Hat) to observe the birdlife and sea lions and for snorkelling. We arrive at the small island of Sombrero Chino, so called due to its unique shape, lying off the southern tip of Santiago. The landscape here is beautiful. It is often possible to see Galapagos penguins and the abundant marine life makes snorkelling here a fantastic experience. There is a large sea lion colony as well as many marine iguanas that can be seen on a guided walk amongst the beautiful volcanic scenery and along the spectacular white coral sand beach. Next we visit Cerro Dragón (Dragon Hill) on the west coast of Isla Santa Cruz to observe land iguanas and a saltwater lagoon frequented by flamingos and other bird species. We take a short walk from the beach to a hypersalinic lagoon frequented by pink flamingos, common stilts, pintail ducks and other species of birds. We pass through a Scalesia tree forest. This tree is endemic to the area with only 400 specimens of Scalesia trees left in the world.






DAY 6: Black Turtle Cove/Quito

This morning we explore the mangrove lagoon at Black Turtle Cove on the northern end of Santa Cruz Island. We head out in pangas to observe the rich and varied marine life between the fresh and salt waters, including manta rays, sea turtles, pelicans and an abundance of other birdlife. Whitetip reef sharks can sometimes be seen gliding by. Later we transfer to the airport for the flight back to Quito. On arrival there is a transfer to the group hotel with time to enjoy one last night in Ecuador's capital.



DAY 7: Quito

Today is free for you to explore Quito at your leisure until your departure time.
