



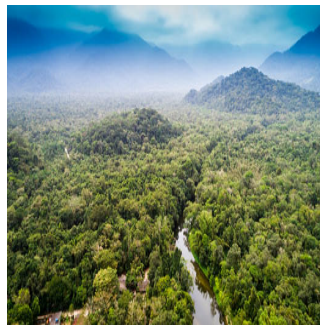
INTRODUCTION

This 3 nights Amazon River luxury cruise on the Aria Amazon begins in the remote colonial city of Iquitos, Peru and transports guests in exceptional comfort deep into the Amazon rainforest, along the Ucayali River, the Amazon's largest tributary, as well as other neighbouring rivers (the Yarapa and Dorado), each one rich in vibrant wildlife and thriving rainforests.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: Friday, Embark at Iquitos

Your guides await you at Iquitos Airport following your flight from Lima. Transfer to the wharf to embark upon the Aria Amazon, a boat of understated luxury. Begin the cruise along the infamous Amazon River before a dinner created by Executive Chef Pedro Miguel Schiaffino with the use of local ingredients.



DAY 2: Saturday, Yacapana Isles & Yarapa River

Rise early to appreciate the sunrise over the vast river and lush rainforest. Later in the morning sail up close to the Yacapana Isles, inhabited by a large amount of iguanas, before the opportunity to fish for piranhas. Enjoy some time at leisure taking in the stunning views from the sundeck while cruising downstream. At sunset, venture onto the Yarapa River, looking out for both pink and grey river dolphins, before continuing the search for wildlife after dark.

DAY 3: Sunday, Yanallpa Flooded Forest & Ucayali River

In the morning explore the seasonally-flooded Yanallpa forest looking for wildlife such as the bald uakari monkey, squirrel monkeys, saddleback tamarin monkeys, sloths and many other species. Following lunch, venture out by boat to spot monkeys, a variety of bird life, and the rare pink dolphins found in the Ucayali River.



DAY 4: Monday, Pacaya Samiria & Disembark

Rise early to witness the Aria Amazon skirting the edge of the vast Pacaya-Samiria Reserve, a flooded forest covering five million acres at the headwaters of the Amazon basin. Venture out by skiff to see the sunrise over the birthplace of the Amazon River, the union of the Ucayali and Marañon tributaries, surrounded by the sights and sounds of abundant birdlife. Continue to the native village of Puerto Miguel to meet the local inhabitants. Disembark the Aria in the afternoon and transfer to the airport for your departure flight. En route, visit the Manatee Rescue Centre, where volunteers help rear manatees seized from fishermen.
