## INTRODUCTION

Deep within the heart of the Amazon lies Inkaterra Hacienda Concepción, located between the Tambopata National Reserve and the shores of the Madre de Dios River. Nineteen private cabanas sitting majestically on stilts and a six-room Casa Grande (large house) with high ceilings and a rustic thatched roof are peppered around the property.

At the lodge you will be introduced to the biodiversity of the rainforest through a wide range of land and river excursions, led by local explorer guides who offer first-hand knowledge of the Peruvian Amazon. Excursions include a visit to Lake Sandoval, inhabited by howler monkeys, caimans and giant river otters.

## ITINERARY

**PERU - HACIENDA CONCEPCION**

**DAY 1: Arrival in Hacienda Concepcion**

Upon your arrival at Puerto Maldonado, begin your journey into the heart of the Amazon rainforest by checking in at the Inkaterra Lounge (Butterfly House). From there, embark on a scenic 25-minute journey along the Madre de Dios River in an outboard dugout canoe to reach Hacienda Concepción, where a delicious buffet lunch featuring organic ingredients and native flavours awaits. After lunch, explore the lush rainforest on foot along the Concepcion trails, where you will learn about the different components, uses, transformations, and significance of primary and secondary rainforest. As the day draws to a close, set off on a twilight river excursion in a canoe. Observe the unique behaviour of nocturnal animals and discover the southern constellations while sailing on the Madre de Dios River and its surrounding Amazon creeks. \*Please note that the itinerary provided is a sample and may be subject to change based on a variety of factors including weather conditions, availability, and your personal preferences.




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## PERU - HACIENDA CONCEPCION

### DAY 2: Amazon activities

Begin your day with a nourishing buffet breakfast before embarking on a trek through terra firma forest into the Tambopata National Reserve, towards the enchanting Lake Sandoval. The reserve is home to an abundance of wildlife, making Madre de Dios the biodiversity capital of Peru. Your guide will explain the Reserve’s conservation efforts and the lake’s formation, while you immerse yourself in this natural wonderland. Once you arrive at the lake, navigate across its mirror-like waters on a dugout canoe to witness the extraordinary ecosystem of endangered giant river otters, blue and yellow macaws, red howler monkeys, black caiman, and the massive paiche fish. Return to the lodge for a delicious lunch, and then gear up for the Canopy Walkway. After a 25-minute motorized canoe ride, arrive at the Canopy Walkway Interpretation Centre and learn about its construction and conservation projects. Ascend one of the two 95-foot towers and traverse the seven suspension bridges that connect the treetop observation platforms. Take in the awe-inspiring views that are impossible to experience from ground level, while spotting white-throated toucans, woodpeckers, trogons, squirrel monkeys, three-toed sloths, and other flora and fauna. As night falls, get ready for an unforgettable adventure during the Hidden Rainforest excursion. Discover the Amazon rainforest at night and observe the intriguing behavior patterns and enhanced senses of nocturnal animals that have adapted to this unique environment. Listen to the mesmerizing sounds of the rainforest and immerse yourself in this magical hidden world.



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### DAY 3: Depart Hacienda Concepcion

After a final buffet breakfast, you'll embark on your last boat ride back to Puerto Maldonado for your departure flight. The trip offers a final opportunity to soak up the stunning natural scenery of the Madre de Dios river, with a chance to spot a variety of wildlife along the way.

We further encourage you to buy appropriate souvenirs and discourage the buying of anything wrongfully made or taken from the environment i.e. shells and endangered species products.
