ITINERARY





DAY 1: Arrival and Highlands

Start your Galapagos adventure with a morning flight from Quito/Guayaquil to Baltra Island. Upon arrival, our representative will warmly welcome you at the airport and transfer you to your vessel. Relax and savor a refreshing welcome drink and a delightful lunch on board. In the afternoon, embark on a fascinating journey to the highlands of Santa Cruz. Here, you'll have the incredible opportunity to hike through the lush landscape and encounter giant tortoises in their natural habitat. Marvel at these magnificent creatures, a true wonder of nature. We recommend wearing comfortable sport shoes, long pants, a raincoat, hat, and sunscreen for this memorable experience.

DAY 2: Moreno Point and Elizabeth Bay

Awaken to the wonders of Moreno Point. Located on the north coast of Isabela Island. Moreno Point offers a mesmerizing landscape adorned with black lava flows and coastal lagoons. Delight in the presence of diverse bird species that call this place home. Behold a panoramic view of the three most active volcanoes in the Galapagos: Sierra Negra, Cerro Azul (Isabela Island), and La Cumbre (Fernandina Island). In the afternoon, set sail for Elizabeth Bay, a haven for penguins. As you explore the west coast of Isabela, discover the marvels of Elizabeth Point, a captivating marine visitor site. Witness the graceful flight of brown pelicans, encounter the enchanting flightless cormorants, spot spotted eagle rays, golden rays, and mingle with the playful sea lions.



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DAY 3: Urbina Bay, Dernandina and Espinoza Point

Embark on a remarkable journey to Urbina Bay in the morning. Nestled at the base of Alcedo Volcano, between Elizabeth Bay and Tagus Cove, Urbina Bay beckons with its captivating wet landing. Traverse the 3.20 km trail, encountering majestic land iguanas, hawks, and tortoises along the way. Don't miss the opportunity to spot the vibrant red and blue lobsters that inhabit this area. In the afternoon, make your way to Espinoza Point, a renowned destination famous for its abundant colonies of marine iguanas. Explore the habitat of the unique flightless cormorant and encounter other fascinating wildlife such as the Galapagos penguin and snakes. Marvel at the scenic beauty of Fernandina Island and its volcanic landscape, a true testament to the fragile and pristine nature of this extraordinary island. Please note that from January to June, during the marine iguana nesting period, we walk with utmost care to protect these precious creatures.

DAY 4: Tagus cove and Vicente Roca Point

Immerse yourself in history as you arrive at Tagus Cove in the morning. Situated west of Darwin Volcano on Isabela Island, this captivating site is adorned with inscriptions dating back to the 1800s, offering a glimpse into the past. Take in the breathtaking views of Darwin Lake, a saltwater lake with a depth of approximately 9 meters. In the afternoon, venture to Vicente Roca Point, a spectacular bay that comprises two separate coves. Prepare to be amazed by the rich marine life that inhabits these waters. Keep a keen eye out for seahorses, graceful sea turtles, and the intriguing Mola-mola, also known as the sunfish, an extraordinary creature that never fails to captivate.





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DAY 5: Espumilla Beach and Egas Port

Arrive at the enchanting Espumilla Beach in the morning, where nature unfolds in all its glory. Discover the beauty of Palo Santo Wood, stroll along the stunning shoreline, and soak in the captivating landscape. This beach holds immense importance for nesting tortoises, adding to its allure and ecological significance. In the afternoon, set foot on Egas Port, a striking black sand beach located in the south of Santiago Island. Gaze at the magnificent Pan de Azucar Volcano that dominates the southern end of the beach. Learn about the intriguing history of failed salt mine explorations in the crater of this volcano. Spot a variety of wildlife, including crabs, nocturnal herons, marine iguanas, cucuves, and land doves, as you embrace the unique wonders of this picturesque location.



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DAY 6: Bachas Beach and Departure

Savor your last morning in the Galapagos as you arrive at Bachas Beach, a pristine paradise nestled in the north of Santa Cruz Island. Stroll along the picturesque one-kilometer-long beach, and uncover the origin of its name, which dates back to World War II when two barges were left ashore. Witness the tranquility and beauty of this coastal gem before bidding it farewell. Afterward, we'll transfer you to the airport for your departure flight, bidding you a fond farewell from the Galapagos Islands, where extraordinary memories will forever linger.
