



INTRODU<u>CTION</u>

Explore the unforgettable east coast of Greenland on this incredible 14 day expedition. Departing from Reykjavik, your voyage will take you through deep fjords and dramatic glacial scenery. You will take a number of adventurous activities through the Northeast Greenland National Park, the largest protected national park in the world. Discover quaint local communities full of rich indigenous history and culture whilst also keeping an eye out for incredible wildlife such as whales and hardy Arctic seabirds.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: Arrival and Embarkation in Reykjavik

In the afternoon, join your fellow passengers to take your group transfer and begin your journey on the G Expedition. Please refer to your welcome letter or the joining instructions posted in the lobby of the start hotel. Make sure you have your passport handy as you are about to embark on the adventure of a lifetime.



DAY 2: Denmark Strait

On our first day at sea, get to know the ship and meet the Expedition team. Enjoy an opportunity to see whales and many different bird species, including soaring fulmars, kittiwakes, gannets guillemots and razorbills.

DAY 3: Tasiilag

Discover Tasiilag, East Greenland's gateway to adventure located on the south-eastern coast of Ammassalik Island. With stunning views across the Tasiilag Fjord's natural harbour, the mountains and the sea beckon travellers to explore. Attend a talk at a local museum and learn about the area's history and culture.



DAY 4: Nansen Fjord

Taking advantage of local ice and weather headlands distantly framed by the highest point in Greenland. With its primary tidewater glacier that



conditions, board a zodiac and explore the majestic Nansen Fjord, a broad inlet with rocky spans a 14km width, copious quantities of icebergs have been known to disgorge into the fiord. Explore one of those rare places on Earth blessed with both awe-inspiring landscape and a compelling natural history.



DAY 5: Greenland Sea

Enjoy a day of Arctic lectures, relaxing on board the ship, and an opportunity to see whales as we cruise further north.



DAY 6: Franz Joseph Fjord - Day 6 to 7

Take two days to explore the stunning Kaiser Franz Joseph Fjord, located in the heart of the Northeast Greenland National Park — the largest national park in the world (and on the world's largest island). See towering icebergs up close as the ship navigates the fjords. Weather and ice conditions permitting, enjoy great opportunities for zodiac cruising and landings in the area.

DAY 8: Scoresbysund - Day 8 to 11

Spend four full days exploring the Scorsbysund area of the Northeast Greenland National Park. Weather and ice conditions permitting, this is a great opportunity to explore fjords that are deep in the heart of Greenland. Sail through and land in some of the world's most spectacular areas, with rarely visited glaciers, bays and inlets. Visit the tiny settlement of Ittoggortoormiit for a look at how these most northerly people live. Northeast Greenland National Park is nearly impossible to reach except on expedition ships. Spectacular geology combined with glacial features create steep mountains raising directly from the sea. Look out for picturesque scenery, wildlife and other interesting landing sites in this unspoiled wilderness. Depending on ice, spend these days exploring the massive fjord system of Northeast Greenland National Park, which includes portions of Scoresbysund. These intricate fjord systems are everything from wide and unimaginable to narrow and steeply spectacular with some of the best mountain scenery in the world. Walking over lush stands of colourful autumn tundra may lead to opportunities to see musk oxen grazing nearby.

DAY 12: Denmark Strait - Day 12 to 13

Enjoy the lecture series while watching the seas for whales. Head towards Iceland and the steaming hot springs of Reykjavík. The view is often complemented by soaring fulmars, kittiwakes, gannets, guillemots, and razorbills.



DAY 14: Disembarkation in Revjavik

Shortly after breakfast, disembark at the Midbakki Pier in the Port of Reykjavik, a short walking distance from downtown.
