

ANTARCTIC PENINSULA - CROSSING THE ANTARCTIC CIRCLE | OCEAN ALBATROS



INTRODUCTION

Discover the Great White Continent's stunning landscapes, glacial mountains, and fantastic animals during this 13-day ultimate Antarctica voyage. This journey is special because there is **NO SET ITINERARY**, which transforms it into a true exploration voyage.

The journey begins as we navigate the Beagle Channel's quiet, grey seas, before heading south, and entering the Drake Passage. The Drake Passage, a body of water that connects the chilly Antarctic with the warmer Atlantic and Pacific Oceans, is renowned for its merry weather and powerful westerly winds. The ship is equipped with stabilisers, strong engines, and a revolutionary reclining bow that guarantees stability and comfort in stormy seas while using very little fuel, so you may travel with confidence even though this voyage may be difficult.

As there is no defined course, our skipper and expedition leader will consider our options while studying ice charts and weather forecasts. The enormous tabular icebergs of the Weddell Sea, the sparsely populated regions south of the Antarctic Circle, or human research stations in the most remote regions of the planet might all be examples of this. There is no doubt that we will experience genuine adventure and thrilling wildlife, we are always on the watch for sea lions, elephant seals, whales, a staggering number of seabirds, and penguins.

Note: The Ultimate Antarctica Experience is designed to have "**No Set Itinerary**" which transforms it into a true exploration tour. The trips that begin in DEC-FEB are called: **Quest for the Circle**, as we intend to go more south and if possible cross the Antarctic Circle at 66°33'2", enjoy longer days with sunlight and even more active penguin rookeries and explore exciting places made possible as the breaking sea ice opens up new avenues.

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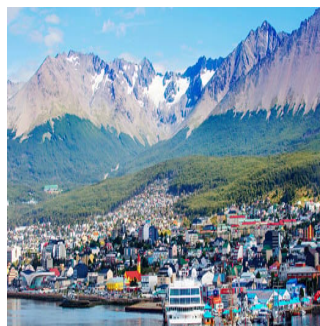
DAY 1: Arrive Ushuaia

After a friendly welcome at the airport and a transfer to your included hotel, take some time to unwind or explore the southernmost city in the world, Ushuaia. Our evening briefing is your opportunity to ask questions and meet some of your fellow explorers.



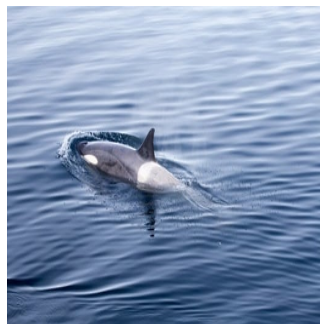
DAY 2: Embarkation

Spend your morning relaxing at the hotel, visiting a museum, or exploring the shops in Ushuaia, before our mid-afternoon escort to the ship. Our Expedition Team and ship staff will welcome you on board and get you settled in, followed by a safety and orientation briefing and our Captain's welcome dinner. We're on our way to Antarctica!



DAY 3: Drake Passage - Day 3 & 4

Join our Polar Experts as they share their vast knowledge of Antarctica, from its enchanting wildlife to its bold history. Participate in our pioneering Citizen Science program or sit back and take in this fabled journey while catching glimpses of rarely seen wildlife. Keep your binoculars handy to identify the many seabirds that escort our ship as we cross the Antarctic Convergence into Antarctica's waters and noticeably cooler temperatures.



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DAY 5: A Toast to the Antarctic Circle - Days 5 to 9

Heading south across the Bransfield Strait, we begin to see the breathtaking outline of the Antarctic Peninsula. Wildlife sightings, including penguins, whales, and fur seals, become more frequent, as do dramatic sculptural icebergs. With an extra day to explore, possibilities abound. We'll look to visit historic sites like the huts at Damoy Point, keep an eye out for humpback whales in Wilhelmina Bay, and continue our twice-daily outings until we reach the crown jewel of this expedition, hoping to enter the jaw-dropping Lemaire Channel by New Year's Eve. Weather permitting, we'll cross the Antarctic Circle at 66°33'S, an achievement that will put you in rare company. We'll raise a glass of bubbly to celebrate the achievement, before heading onward toward any number of historic and rarely visited British Survey bases, after which we turn back north.



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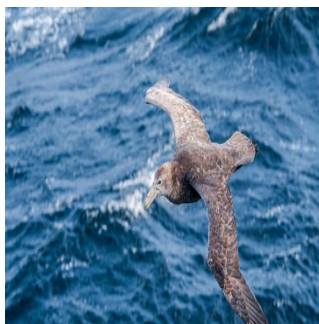

DAY 10: South Shetland Islands - Day 10

This archipelago represents the northernmost tip of Antarctica, standing proud against the relentless force of the Southern Ocean. The ice-capped peaks of Livingstone, Greenwich, and King George Islands offer a stunning backdrop to explore. And despite the furious elements, the islands boast a remarkable richness of wildlife, with numerous colonies of Gentoo and Chinstrap Penguins dotting the island shores, accompanied by an array of formidable seabirds like the predatory Giant Petrels. Weather permitting, we'll explore the eerie landscape of Deception Island, an active volcanic crater with black steaming sands and rusting ruins, and immerse ourselves in the history of Yankee Harbour, once a vital anchorage for sealers.



DAY 11: Crossing the Drake Passage Northbound - Day 11&12

We leave this magical place and make our way north, once again crossing the legendary Drake Passage. We have one last hurrah as we celebrate the conclusion of our expedition with a special slideshow, passenger photo contest, and a final celebratory meal together. Congratulations, explorers!



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DAY 13: Disembarkation in Ushuaia

With huge smiles on weary, content faces, we disembark in the morning, letting you catch a flight to Buenos Aires or stay in Ushuaia for more sights and adventure.
