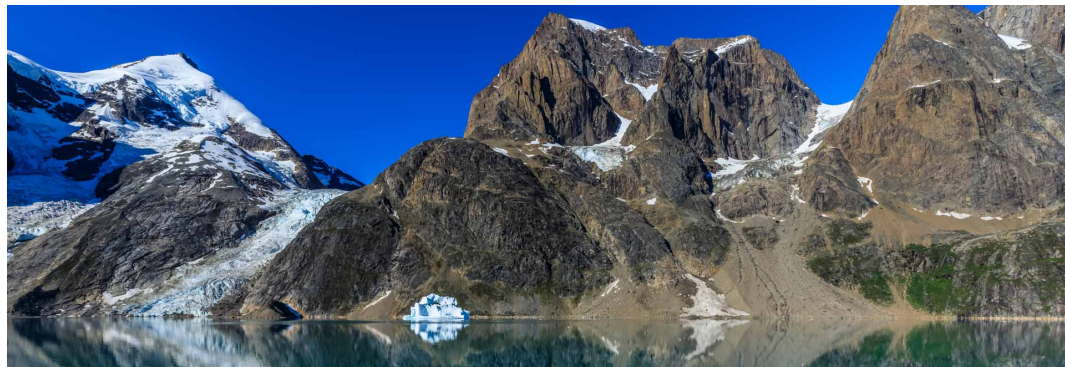


THE ARCTIC - GREENLAND TO ICELAND: ARCTIC EXPLORER | OCEAN VICTORY



INTRODUCTION

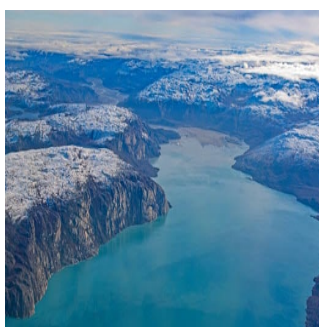
This expedition itinerary follows a classic route from West to East Greenland, offering a clear look at the country's communities, landscapes and cultural history. Connected to both Inuit and Norse heritage with visits to small settlements, meet local residents and observe daily life in places such as Kangaamiut, Nuuk and Tasiilaq to gain local perspectives. With a mix of Zodiac cruising through stunning fjords and time ashore for guided walks through archaeological sites and meaningful cultural interactions make this journey really come to life.

Sailing days highlight Greenland's varied coastlines, from the fjords of the south such as Prins Christians Sund to the glacier-filled waterways of the east. You may witness calving ice, marine wildlife and shifting Arctic weather conditions from the ship or during Zodiac outings which provide excellent opportunities for photography. The voyage ends with a crossing of the Denmark Strait before arriving in Reykjavik, Iceland.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: Embarkation in Kangerlussuaq

On day one, we arrive in Kangerlussuaq, Greenland's only inland town and a key air hub with a rich Cold War history. Upon arrival, we transfer by Zodiac to the Ocean Victory, settle into our cabins, complete a safety drill, and then toast with champagne as we begin our journey through the stunning Kangerlussuaq fjord.

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DAY 2: Kangaamiut and Evighedsfjorden

On the first full day of our voyage, we arrive in Kangaamiut, a village where traditional hunting, fishing, and weather shape daily life. Guests can hike for panoramic views, and enjoy a warm cultural welcome with local crafts, food, and performance. In the afternoon, we venture into 'The Eternity Fjord' (Evighedsfjorden) by Zodiac, cruising past majestic glaciers and dramatic bird cliffs, a thrilling and unforgettable start to our Arctic voyage.



DAY 3: Nuuk

Home to 20,000 residents, Nuuk, Greenland's capital, offers culture, history, and stunning natural beauty. Inhabited since 2200 B.C. by Paleo-Inuit and later by Norse settlers, Nuuk is now Greenland's cultural and political center, featuring the Parliament, National Museum (home of the spellbinding Qilakitsoq mummies), Katuaq cultural center, local art workshops, and cozy cafés. Affectionately known as "Nuuk York" by locals, it stands as a singular blend of the ancient and the contemporary.



DAY 4: At Sea

From Nuuk, we sail southward along Greenland's rugged coast. Nearly all of Greenland's settlements lie on the western coast, facing the Davis Strait. Warm Atlantic currents enrich these waters, attracting whales, seals, human hunters, and many seabirds so keep an eye out during our day at sea!



DAY 5: Qassiarsuk and Itilleq

Next, we cruise through Tunulliarfik Fjord to Qassiarsuk, a lush village known for sheep farming and its rich Norse history. Founded in 1924, the modern village sits on the site of Erik the Red's 10th-century farm, Brattahlíð. Legend has it that his wife Thjodhild refused to join her pagan husband's bed until he built her a church, the first in the Americas. In the afternoon, we hike from nearby Itilleq through lush green fields to Igaliku and the ruins of Garðar bishopric, the seat of Norse Greenlandic power.



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DAY 6: Appilaattoq and Prins Christian Sund

In the morning, we reach Aappilattoq, a small, remote village beneath granite cliffs, known for its traditional lifestyle, scenic hiking, and famous local choir. In the afternoon we continue eastwards as we sail through spectacular Prins Christian Sund, a 60 km iceberg-filled strait linking East and West Greenland. Surrounded by mountains, glaciers, and valleys, it's one of the world's most spectacular waterways.



DAY 7: Skjoldungen & Saqqisikuik

Today, we explore Skjoldungen, a stunning fjord on Greenland's southeast coast, known to locals as Saqqisikuik. Once visited by Inuit and briefly settled in the 20th century, it is now remote and uninhabited. Surrounded by breath-taking peaks, highlights include Thryms Glacier and the valley of Dronning Marie Dal. Weather permitting, we may land to explore ashore or Zodiac cruise by the majestic glacier.



DAY 8: Sermilikfjord

Our next stop is the breathtaking Sermilikfjord, a vast ice-choked fjord which drains the colossal Helheim Glacier. Armadas of towering icebergs drift from the Greenland Ice Sheet out into the North Atlantic, creating one of the most spectacular natural sights on Earth. Join your Expedition Team on a Zodiac cruise and marvel at the gigantic icebergs, natural ice sculptures tens of thousands of years in the making!



DAY 9: Ikateq and Kuummiit

During the morning, we approach Ikateq, also known as Blue Two East, a haunting remnant of the American military presence on Greenland during the Second World War. Marvel at the remains of this vital airbase, untouched since it was abandoned in 1947. In the afternoon we reposition to Kuummiit, a small village deep in the calm waters of Ammassalik Fjord. Here we will have a chance to connect with the friendly locals and experience East Greenlandic culture in one of country's most beautiful and welcoming villages.



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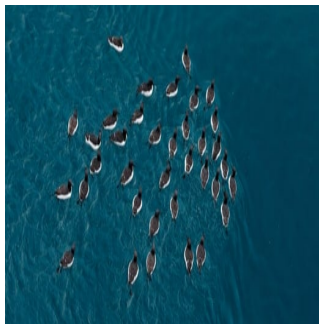
DAY 10: Tasiilaq, East Greenland

Tasiilaq is East Greenland’s largest settlement, sitting on rugged Ammassalik Island. Isolated from European contact until its founding as a trading post in 1894, it preserves the unique culture of the Tunumiit people. Once home to Greenland’s last shamans, Tasiilaq is the origin of the tupilak, a feared magical creature, now a celebrated art form. Visitors can meet sled dogs (with owners’ permission), experience drum dancing, hike tundra meadows, and visit the famous Stunk Artist’s Workshop.



DAY 11: At sea across the Denmark strait

The Denmark Strait, a narrow passage between Iceland and Greenland, teems with rich marine life. Join your Expedition Team on the outer decks to watch for wildlife. Departing Greenland, the team shares insights on ecology, geology, and wildlife, as well as toasting the end of our Arctic adventure at the Captain’s Farewell Cocktail Party. Cheers!



DAY 12: Disembarkation in Reykjavik

Hallgrímskirkja Church towers over Reykjavik, a vibrant city known for Nordic cuisine, unique museums, and excellent shopping. Such a bustling capital may feel strange after the remote wilderness of the Arctic! After a hearty breakfast, it is time to bid a fond farewell to the Crew and Expedition Team, and descend the gangway back to dry land with memories of the voyage of a lifetime. *Please note: Cruise itinerary is subject to change depending on weather conditions, ice conditions and other factors.
